# Capital Budget Monitoring Report – December 31, 2019

## SUMMARY

The purpose of this report is to provide the Toronto Public Library (TPL) Board with a summary of the capital expenditures for the year ended December 31, 2019.

The capital spend rate in 2019 was 85.9%, with a five-year average of 86.8%, which results in an exceptionally high capital program delivery.

The unspent balance of \$5.011 million is comprised of \$5.743 million from nine capital projects that are underspent at year end partially offset by cash flows of \$0.732 million from five projects that are spending ahead of schedule.

# FINANCIAL IMPACT

Capital spending during 2019 totalled \$30.576 million or 85.9% of the approved gross cash flow of \$35.587 million, resulting in a final unspent net balance of \$5.011 million, which is comprised of \$5.743 million from nine capital projects that are underspent at year end partially offset by cash flows of \$0.732 million from five projects that are spending ahead of schedule as shown on Table 1 below.

An in-year budget adjustment will be requested in Q1 2020 to reduce the 2020 cash flow to offset the 2019 cash flow over-expenditure of \$0.732 million from five projects that are spending ahead of schedule.

The unspent balance from nine capital projects of \$5.743 million will be carried forward to 2020-2022 as shown on Table 2 below.

# ISSUE BACKGROUND

TPL's Council-approved <u>2019 capital budget</u> is \$35.587 million gross, which is comprised of \$28.674 million of new cash flows and \$6.913 million of unspent balances carried forward from 2018.

# COMMENTS

For the year ending December 31, 2019, the Library spent \$30.576 million or 85.9% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$35.587 million, resulting in a final unspent net balance of \$5.011 million. The average five-year capital spending rate is 86.8%, well above the City average.

These results should be considered draft until the external audit of the financial statements is completed.

## <u>Project Status</u>

Attachment 1 includes a list of all active projects, providing 2019 year-end and life-todate project expenditure status, and overspent and underspent cash flow balances. A brief description of 2019 accomplishments, significant expenditure variances and the completion status of capital projects is provided below:

- The *Albert Campbell Renovation* project's expenditure totalled \$1.359 million, or 49.2%, of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$2.763 million. Due to the length of the building permit approval process, the construction start was delayed. The unspent cash flow balance of \$1.404 million has been carried forward to 2020-2022 as detailed in Table 2 above.
- The *Albion Renovation* project's expenditure totalled \$0.099 million, or 100% of the 2019 approved cash flow. This project is completed.
- The *Bayview-Bessarion Relocation* project's expenditures totalled \$2.379 million or 110.4% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$2.154 million. This project spending is ahead of schedule. The over-expenditure of \$0.225 million is due to pre-spending of 2020 budgeted cash flows in 2019. An in-year budget adjustment will be requested in Q1 2020 to reduce the 2020 cash flow to offset the pre-spending in 2019.
- The *Centennial Renovation & Expansion Design* project's expenditure totalled \$0.167 million or 57.7% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$0.289 million. The project is experiencing minor delays due to negotiations with external stakeholders and property owners. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.122 million has been carried forward to 2020.
- The *Dawes Road Construction & Expansion* project's expenditure totalled \$0.450 million or 160.4% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$0.281 million. This project spending is ahead of schedule. The over-expenditure of \$0.170 million is due to pre-spending of 2020 budgeted cash flows in 2019. An in-year budget adjustment will be requested in Q1 2020 to reduce the 2020 cash flow to offset the prespending in 2019.
- The *Fort York Library Construction* project's expenditure totalled \$0.084 million or 100% of the 2019 approved cash flow. This project is completed.
- The *Guildwood Renovation & Expansion* project's expenditure totalled \$1.077 million or 100% of the 2019 approved cash flow. This project is completed.
- The North York Central Library Renovation Phase 2 project's expenditure totalled \$3.711 million representing 100.2% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$3.705 million. This project spending is ahead of schedule. The over-expenditure of \$0.006 million is due to pre-spending of 2020 budgeted cash flows in 2019. An in-year budget adjustment will be requested in Q1 2020 to reduce the 2020 cash flow to offset the pre-spending in 2019.
- The *Perth / Dupont Relocation to 299 Campbell Ave Design* project's expenditure totalled \$0.005 million or 100% of the 2019 approved cash flow. This project is completed.

- The *Richview Building Elements* project's expenditure totalled \$0.061 million or 26.0% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$0.236 million. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.175 million has been carried forward to 2020.
- The *St.Clair/Silverthorn Reconstruction* project's expenditure totalled \$1.728 million or 100% of the 2019 approved cash flow. This project is completed.
- The *Wychwood Library Renovation* project's expenditure totalled \$4.260 million or 65.5% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$6.509 million. Construction was set back due to late delivery of structural steel. The unspent cash flow balance of \$2.249 million has been carried forward to 2020-2022 as detailed in Table 2 above.
- The *York Woods* project's expenditure totalled \$1.858 million or 78.3% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$2.372 million. Construction did not start until late fall. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.514 million has been carried forward to 2020.
- The *Multi-Branch State of Good Repair* Program expenditures totalled \$5.559 million or 104.0% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$5.346 million. This state of good repair program is an effective way of keeping branches operational until a major renovation can be funded. This project spending is ahead of schedule. The over-expenditure of \$0.213 million is due to pre-spending of 2020 budgeted cash flows in 2019. An in-year budget adjustment will be requested in Q1 2020 to reduce the 2020 cash flow to offset the pre-spending in 2019.
- The *Technology Asset Management Program* expenditures totalled \$5.000 million or 99.9% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$5.006 million. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.006 million has been carried forward to 2020.
- The *Virtual Branch Services* project's expenditure totalled \$1.406 million or 109.1% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$1.288 million. This project spending is ahead of schedule. The over-expenditure of \$0.118 million is due to pre-spending of 2020 budgeted cash flows in 2019. An in-year budget adjustment will be requested in Q1 2020 to reduce the 2020 cash flow to offset the pre-spending in 2019.
- The *Integrated Payment Solutions* project's expenditure totalled \$0.401 million or 59.5% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$0.675 million. This project is comprised of rolling out new cash registers and fines payment at self checkout terminals. The development phase of cash registers took longer than expected, which resulted in delays in installation. The rollout of fines payment at self checkout terminals was also experiencing delays due to technical issues. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.273 million has been carried forward to 2020.
- The *Expansion of Technological Efficiencies* project's expenditure totalled \$0.494 million or 74.3% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$0.665 million. There were

minor delays in the implementation of the VOIP project. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.171 million has been carried forward to 2020.

• The Answerline & Community Space Rental Modernization project's expenditure totalled \$0.475 million or 36.4% of the 2019 approved cash flow of \$1.304 million. Project is delayed due to ongoing contract negotiation with vendor. The unspent cash flow balance of \$0.829 million has been carried forward to 2020.


